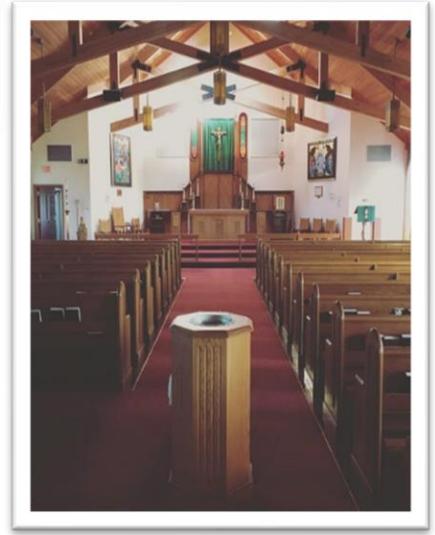


## A LETTER TO OUR ST. IGNATIUS FAMILY

**Dear Ignatians ~**

Grace and peace to you from God our Father, Jesus our Savior, and the Holy Spirit our Guide.

It is an incredible honor that I was ordained a priest 45 years ago – first serving 28 years in the Roman Church, and then received to serve in the Episcopal Church the last 17 years. These years and experiences have been a blessing of “grace upon grace.”

**In my *Letter of Agreement* with you dated March 1, 2019, I was called by a vestry vote, and with the Bishop’s approval, to serve as your priest-in-charge for three years ending February 28, 2022. Now with Terry’s and my time with you coming to its contractual end, we will return to Florida.**

Working with our vestry, treasurer, and many other fine volunteers as a team of leaders, *together* we have promoted worship, fellowship, formation, and outreach – even in the midst of a pandemic. We can

perhaps be proudest of our “Mission of the Month” outreach efforts as a parish family – each month, opening our hearts and reaching beyond our church doors to assist an agency or entity nearby in Illinois and/or Wisconsin. In this *you* have been a blessing to our wider community.

My unexpected hospitalization and diagnosis of end stage kidney failure has certainly changed my life. For the last two years I have been on an inflexible Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday dialysis schedule with four hour treatments per session. I have unsuccessfully sought a donor for a transplant, and as a result require dialysis three days every week for the rest of my life.

With the end of our contractual time with you approaching, Terry and I have been praying about our future. I will soon be 73, and we have revised our lives to work around my dialysis reality. We are especially grateful to Rev. Andrea Mysen, Director of Ministry for the Diocese of Chicago, along with family, friends, and others who have offered listening ears, supportive prayer, and true concern.

**Andrea met with our current vestry twice in recent months, and she and the Bishop's staff will work with the new vestry you will elect at our January 30th Annual Meeting to begin the work of discerning your future. The Diocese will guide and equip you through your present and future needs.**

Terry and I have contacted our former Florida realtor who is assisting us in downsizing to a small condo; we're listing our house here; and I'm making arrangements to transfer to a reputable dialysis center.

We contacted our former Bishop, and have received a vestry call to serve the people at St. George Episcopal Church in Bradenton, Florida as their part-time interim priest.

When Terry and I leave next month, we want to do so on the best possible terms with you. Together we've written three years of our parish history. During these years our parish family thrived spiritually – even surviving a pandemic – as we did ministry together, to God's greater honor and glory, while in service to you and to our wider community.

We thank each of you for the privilege of sharing your faith journey during these years. Terry and I now ask your prayers as we leave you to serve others. Do know that you will always have a place in our hearts and prayers.
